
As well as hoping to see some sunshine this July and August, the Church of England online media is wanting to see and share wonderful photos of church doors from across the country.


The Church of England has over 16,000 church buildings in England, each with a unique community offering, surrounding, and story.

A very lively popular and friendly group which attracts between 40-50 toddlers plus adults every Monday 9 - 11am. It runs in *term time* only. The group is run primarily by a team of 5 volunteers. This is a safe place to come and experience the highs and lows of being a new parent. We attract mums, couples, dads and grandparents (particularly when mum returns to work). We have play mats, rugs etc for the tiny babies and good quality, safe and stimulating toys and a ball pool for the babies to play with as they begin to sit up, move and eventually walk. There is opportunity to weigh the babies as well. Included in the low price is a choice of hot and cold drinks and a selection of lovely homemade cakes or biscuits.

Sandylands Drop In






