<u>Letter from Rev Michelle Woodcock</u> Priest-in-Charge of the Beacon Team Churches

Dear Friends,

You may already know, that at the end of January I was privileged to be invited to attend a Clergy Consultation at St. George's House, Windsor. It entailed living, worshipping, working with other clergy and studying all within the grounds of Windsor Castle as a guest at St. George's House. I was one of twenty-four serving ministers from across this country, Scotland, Ireland and America who were invited to attend. Our consultation was entitled "Nurturing Wisdom; Nurturing our Growth as ministers." The conversations we shared remain private to our group, but I can certainly say for myself that although it was a very demanding week on every level, it was transformative and has encouraged me as I continue to serve as a Mission Community Leader here in the Beacon Team Ministry. The history behind the set up at St. George's House is very interesting, and more can be found on the website, if that sort of thing appeals to you.

Their overall vision is:

"To effect change for the better in our society by nurturing wisdom through dialogue."

They go on to say this... "The values of the House are openness, honesty, trust and respect. People from all areas of society, holding diverse views, opinions and beliefs come here to debate freely. The art of consultation seeks to nurture Wisdom and open up the possibility of a different and better world.

The Wisdom we seek to nurture affirms and encourages, questions and surprises. It searches out new possibilities and desires the best for all our people and our planet. It is forward-looking and free from contemporary idols. It fosters personal and community transformation. The practical result of such Wisdom is trust, equality, and peace.

It is Wisdom based on knowledge, understanding, good judgement and farsighted decision making. It is Wisdom for our time."

I found my time there to be a real oasis. In a time when The Church of England is facing many challenges and trials on many different levels, it was encouraging to meet serving ministers who felt able to be so open and honest about their own challenges and who were willing to share wisdom, sometimes hard won, and embrace questions that helped us all consider how we might continue to lead as steady, faithful ministers, sharing the gospel & Good News of Jesus in an increasingly troubled and turbulent landscape.

In the book of Proverbs, there is a Proverb that says:

"Know also that wisdom is like honey for you: If you find it, there is a future hope for you and your hope will not be cut off." (Proverbs 24:14)

It can feel difficult to find hope at times like this, but during the consultation I was reminded again of the commandment to

"Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength' and to 'Love your neighbour as yourself." Mark 12:30-31

There is wisdom in holding on to these simple, but complex truths as we journey through increasingly challenging times. How are we showing love to our neighbour? What simple ways can we help the places we inhabit become places where wisdom is nurtured, and love and kindness have chance to grow and flourish? What part does God have in all of this?

By wrestling with these, and other questions, we begin to take steps along the road to wisdom. Please pray for me as I continue to seek God's wisdom in all that lies ahead and be assured of my prayers for you.

Totters

A very lively popular and friendly group which attracts between 40-50 toddlers plus adults every **Monday 9 - 11am**. It runs in *term time* only. The group is run primarily by a team of 5 volunteers. We provide support for the adults as well as activities for the children. Drinks for adults included in the fee. There are plenty of toys (large

and small), sit and ride toys, art and crafts, tuff tray messy activities, play dough, sand and sometimes a bouncy castle etc. We also have a quieter room for adults and children who find the other rooms too noisy and busy. The session ends with a healthy snack and a singing time.



Cornerstone Bumps and Babies (CBBs)

This small and friendly group runs in *term time only* on a Monday afternoon from 1.30 - 3pm. It is run by 2 volunteers. We have between 6 - 14 babies from birth to 1 year old plus adults attend on a regular basis. We offer friendship, advice and support to the adults. This is a safe place to come and experience the highs and lows of being a new parent. We attract mums, couples, dads and grandparents (particularly when mum returns to work). We have play mats, rugs etc for the tiny babies and good quality, safe and stimulating toys and a ball pool for the babies to play with as they begin to sit up, move and eventually walk. There is opportunity to weigh the babies as well. Included in the low price is a choice of hot and cold drinks and a selection of lovely homemade cakes or biscuits.

Top Thorn Farm

The idea for my Young Adult novel published a year ago, had been brewing within me for some time. When working as the librarian in a rural secondary school, I couldn't help noticing the lack of farmthemed fiction aimed at teenagers. This was before *Clarkson's Farm* came to TV screens, although of course these stories were intended for adults. In my school, students in years 7, 8 and 9 were required to



read a fiction book during their weekly library lesson and I would sometimes be approached by frustrated youngsters complaining about the lack of stories relating to their own life experience. They wanted to read about driving tractors and quad bikes, lambing and working with sheepdogs.

Several years later, I wrote *Top Thorn Farm*, setting it in an imaginary farming community in the South Lakes. Use of local names is for authenticity but bears no intended connection to individuals. Dialect speech is used. I also planned it to be dyslexia-friendly. Upon an author friend's recommendation, who is also an ex school librarian/English teacher, I approached an editor who took me through the process of producing a book for publication. I am grateful to both.

My main character is in his last year at school and would rather be driving a tractor on his family farm than having to prepare for his GCSE's. He has to accept however, small hill farms struggle and the future he'd envisaged for himself isn't going to happen. A farm accident, an outbreak of bovine TB, storm damage and the conflict of school life and home contribute to his self-discovery.

The sequel *Finding* set 2/3 years later, will be published late February or early March 2025.




