<u>Letter from Rev Michelle Woodcock,</u> Priest-in-Charge of the Beacon Team Churches

Dear Friends,

As I write this letter we have had the exciting news that our home in Skelsmergh is almost complete and we will move in on 9th July. I'm excited and overwhelmed in equal measure....there's a reason that vicars usually move house before they begin their job! It's going to be a crazy few weeks of juggling moving and working. Please bear with us!

One of the things that I'm most excited about is that we will be living right next door to one of my churches. As a vicar you are expected to say/ pray the daily office, which is a collection of Bible readings and prayers set for each day. It can be said anywhere at any time, although I usually begin my day with it. It is my intention to do this in the church quite regularly, and once I settle into a pattern I'll let you know so that you can join me from time to time if you wish.

I wonder what you think about prayer. Is it something that you do regularly? Is it something that you've heard of but wouldn't know how to begin, or something mysterious and scary?

I heard a story once about a child in a primary school who asked if he could say the opening prayer.

"Heavenly Father, I thank you for the letter A, I thank you for the letter B, I thank you for the letter C..." The teacher realized that this could be a very long prayer, but didn't stop him. He went on to give thanks for every letter of the alphabet and then said

"Father, I thank you for the number 1, and for the number 2, and for the number 3..." at this point the teacher panicked as she didn't know how high the boy could count. She resisted the urge to stop him, and thankfully when he reached the number 20 he said

"Finally, Father, I thank you for my teacher, who is the first person to ever let me finish my prayer. Amen"

It made me laugh, but actually this prayer is perfectly valid. Prayers can be well crafted, well thought out words that have been written down and used for many years, but they can also be the simple cries of our hearts. "Lord help me in this moment" is just as valid as a long, theologically well constructed prayer. Sometimes I think that we make the idea of prayer too complicated and beyond our reach. It's something that every-

one can do at any time and in any place. The Bible teaches us "Don't worry about anything: instead, pray about everything. Tell God what you need and thank him for all he has done." (Philippians 4:6 New Living Translation)

Part of my job, and one of the greatest privileges of it is to pray for the people in my parishes. I do this every day. If you are going through a time when you would appreciate prayer for a specific reason then please let me know. If you pray, please pray for us in these crazy but exciting times too! "Ask and it will be given to you, seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you. For everyone who asks receives, the one who seeks finds and to the one who knocks, the door will be opened." (Matthew 7:7-8)

What is your prayer today? May you know God's peace and hear his answer.

Remembering the faith of Eric Liddell – 100 years ago at the Paris Olympics

The 2024 Paris Olympics (26 July – 11 August) will soon be here. It was 100 years ago this summer, also at the Paris Olympics, that a young science student at Edinburgh University, Eric Liddell, ran an astonishing race that caught the imagination of millions worldwide.

Liddell had been born in China in 1902, to Scottish missionaries there. Early on, he had made a deep commitment to Jesus Christ, and sensed he was being called to spend his life in serving others. But Liddell was also an outstanding sportsman, playing rugby for Scotland before settling on athletics.

When he was chosen for the Paris Olympics, he expected to run his preferred 100m. But then came the news that the race would be run on a Sunday, and Liddell refused. Quickly, he trained for the 200m and 400m. He took bronze at the 200m, but no one expected much from him at the 400m. Instead, he won, and even broke the world record in the process.

After the Olympics, Liddell felt God calling him to his life's work. He went back to China, to teach in a Christian college. As the Second World War loomed, he sent his wife and children home, but stayed on himself. By 1943 Liddell was confined to a brutal prison camp, where he shone among the fellow prisoners – encouraging them, teaching Bible classes, and praying for both his fellow inmates and the prison wardens. Deeply malnourished, his health failed and in 1945, just months before the war ended, he died, aged only 43. In 1981 his story was made into the Oscar-winning film *Chariots of Fire*.

We welcomed our speaker, David Last, and his wife Pauline, as well as members and friends. During the meeting we wished Elizabeth Brassington a very happy birthday. Thank you to our members & friends for supporting the Bring & Buy table.

David is an avid traveller and his talk (with slides) entitled "In search of lord Buddha" was about his visit to Bhutan. There was also a display of various flags and objects that he had brought back from his many trips.

David gave some background to Buddhism, the religion of the country. Siddhartha Gautama, referred to as the Buddha was born in what is now Nepal, to royal parents but renounced his home life to live as a wandering ascetic and religious teacher and founded Buddhism.

He also spoke about the Dalai Lama, the highest spiritual leader and head of Tibetan Buddhism; the current or 14th Dalai Lama was born in 1935 in Tibet but was forced into exile when he was 24 years old, and now lives in India; it is forbidden to take any photographs in his presence.

David was wearing a silk scarf that he had been given and described Bhutan as a very clean place; there is cost to visiting the country, a daily minimum charge which includes a Sustainable Development Fee. He explained how a King's fund provides health and education, and that all lessons are in English (the official classroom language).

This is only a small part of David's informative and interesting talk. Many thanks, David and Pauline.

Sometimes our very youngest members leave after a drink and biscuit at 7.15pm


