Just before the busy day, in that lull where the anticipation is building, why not join us in the beautiful setting of St. Mary's Longsleddale? We will share a reflective Christmas Communion service with thoughtful readings, traditional carols and space to be quiet and calm before the hustle and bustle of Christmas Day.



"The speaker at our October Meeting was Count Nico, who was born in the Karpalc region of Ukraine. During WW2 his parents were taken to Germany to work in the labour camps and Nico and his sister went into a children's home, After the war, his parents were classed as traitors for having worked for the Germans, his father was sent to the Donbas region and his mother to a chemical factory in Siberia. Nico and his sister were separated when he was conscripted and he did military service until his thirties; eventually he came to England to the Russian Embassy , and then the trade consulate, where he met his wife, Marie (from Lancaster). They married in 2006 and they later came to live in Old Hutton.

Nico's father died in 2020 and left him a small estate in Ukraine; the area is mountainous, and similar to the Lake District. He visits about 3 times a year to meet with local officials. He found his sister, a great surprise, as he had not known where she had been since the end of the war. The area has not been involved in any fighting, but the sound of bomb blasts could be heard in the distance.

Nico also spoke about various Ukrainian traditions regarding marriage and religious celebrations; Christmas is celebrated but Easter is the main celebration. We enjoyed this talk." report from *Eileen Allen Happy birthday, Kathleen, our love and best wishes on your very special day.*

Totters and Bumps and Babies

Totters

A very lively popular and friendly group which attracts between 40-50 toddlers plus adults every **Monday 9 - 11am**. It runs in *term time* only. The group is run primarily by a team of 5 volunteers. We provide support for the adults as well as activities for the children. Drinks for adults included in the fee. There are plenty of toys (large

and small), sit and ride toys, art and crafts, tuff tray messy activities, play dough, sand and sometimes a bouncy castle etc. We also have a quieter room for adults and children who find the other rooms too noisy and busy. The session ends with a healthy snack and a singing time.



Cornerstone Bumps and Babies (CBBs)

This small and friendly group runs in *term time only* on a Monday afternoon from 1.30 - 3pm. It is run by 2 volunteers. We have between 6 - 14 babies from birth to 1 year old plus adults attend on a regular basis. We offer friendship, advice and support to the adults. This is a safe place to come and experience the highs and lows of being a new parent. We attract mums, couples, dads and grandparents (particularly when mum returns to work). We have play mats, rugs etc for the tiny babies and good quality, safe and stimulating toys and a ball pool for the babies to play with as they begin to sit up, move and eventually walk. There is opportunity to weigh the babies as well. Included in the low price is a choice of hot and cold drinks and a selection of lovely homemade cakes or biscuits.
