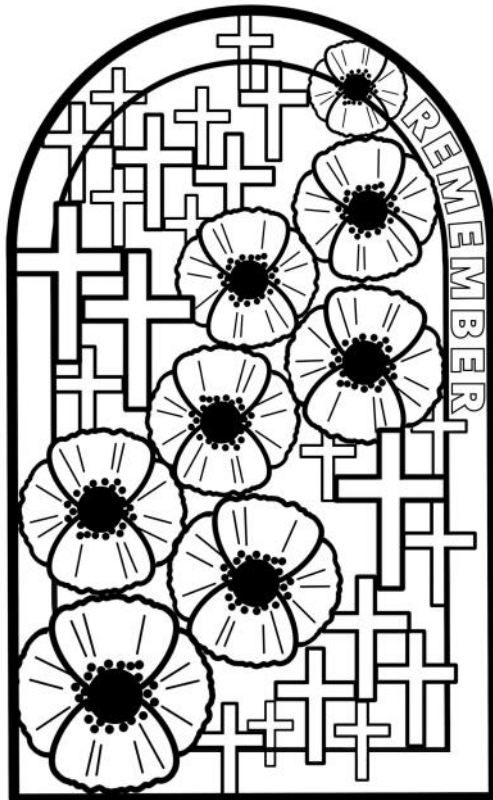

## Letter from Rev Michelle Woodcock

### Priest-in-Charge of the Beacon Team Churches

*"Remember, remember the 5th of November, gunpowder, treason and plot..."*

I remember reciting this verse with glee as a child around this time of the year. For me it added up to cold, brisk mornings and the odd evening spent eating hot sausages around a roaring fire followed by spectacular fireworks and sparklers. Having a birthday in November means that I have very happy memories of this time of the year, although of course as the years have gone on there are also some sad memories too, especially since my dad died suddenly on my birthday in 1997.

This month we take some time out during the church year to remember. We have services for All Souls at the start of the month in Kendal and Burneside where we can remember and give thanks for all those who have influenced our lives and who have gone on before us. Shortly after that on 11th November at 11am and at our services on 10th November we remember all those who have given their lives in service of their country during times of war and peace.

Remembering is very important to us. It is important to remember the sacrifice made by those who have gone before us, those who gave their lives so that we might live ours in freedom. It is also important to remember those happy times we spent with those who have now passed away and give thanks for the influence they may have had on our lives.

In our church services we regularly take time to remember. We remember those who are struggling or in any kind of need in our prayers and ask God to be with them and help them. We remember with thanks the good things that God has given us and during September we spent time remembering the work of our farmers and giving thanks for them.

Many of our services include Holy Communion and this is an important act of remembering as well as being an activity that sustains and nourishes Christians in their faith. When we come to communion we remember especially the sacrifice that Jesus

made for us by dying on the cross.

In this month of remembrance, why not take some time out yourself to remember? You may wish to give thanks to God for all those happy memories that you have. Perhaps you might bring some of those difficult and sad memories to God's attention too and seek his help in finding a new dimension or way forward with those challenging aspects of life.

May God bless you and your memories this month.

## Salvation Army Christmas Present Appeal 2024

In Kendal we provided presents for 232 local children last Christmas and this year the number in need is likely to increase again

For each child we try to provide a main present, and a selection of other presents, so that if they don't receive anything else at all, their Christmas is ok.

Each child receives:

a chocolate selection box, something to read, something to do (art/craft/pens/colouring book) something to cuddle, something to wear (hat/scarf/socks)

something to play (board game/jigsaw) something smelly (bubble bath/soap)

We also provide wrapping paper and sellotape for the parents.

We have people who donate to our appeal because they remember that, as children, their only gifts came from the Salvation Army.



We welcomed Nina from Manna House to our September Meeting. Members and friends learned how the name of the organisation came from the Bible – *manna from heaven*. Nina shared how she had originally gone on a Friday to wash the dishes but had become front of house after three weeks.

Most clients arrive at the centre through no fault of their own. One of the common misconceptions is that drink and drugs are involved but that is not so in most cases. Providing a warm welcome with a smile is important – and also a warm meal.

Forms often need completing and can be difficult, so a person is employed part-time to help with this. There are advisors available to help people; there can be months of listening. Dentists, doctors, hair-dressers and others give of their time free. During the pandemic, Manna House stayed open with a skeleton staff; clients received their Covid injections by a team visiting from Captain French Surgery. People who are having to sleep outdoors are given dry sleeping bags and tents. There is a one person Pod on site, which is very private and can be stayed in for up to two nights.

This was a very moving talk, addressing several issues and very informative.

## Totters and Bumps and Babies

### Totters

A very lively popular and friendly group which attracts between 40-50 toddlers plus adults every **Monday 9 - 11am**. It runs in *term time* only. The group is run primarily by a team of 5 volunteers. We provide support for the adults as well as activities for the children. Drinks for adults included in the fee. There are plenty of toys (large and small), sit and ride toys, art and crafts, tuff tray messy activities, play dough, sand and sometimes a bouncy castle etc. We also have a quieter room for adults and children who find the other rooms too noisy and busy. The session ends with a healthy snack and a singing time.



### Cornerstone Bumps and Babies (CBBs)

This small and friendly group runs in *term time only* on a Monday afternoon from 1.30 - 3pm. It is run by 2 volunteers. We have between 6 - 14 babies from birth to 1 year old plus adults attend on a regular basis. We offer friendship, advice and support to the adults. This is a safe place to come and experience the highs and lows of being a new parent. We attract mums, couples, dads and grandparents (particularly when mum returns to work). We have play mats, rugs etc for the tiny babies and good quality, safe and stimulating toys and a ball pool for the babies to play with as they begin to sit up, move and eventually walk. There is opportunity to weigh the babies as well. Included in the low price is a choice of hot and cold drinks and a selection of lovely homemade cakes or biscuits.

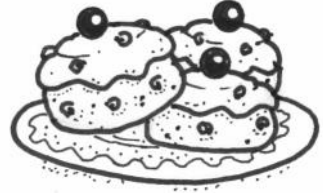

## **What is a Hassock? Could you rehome one?**

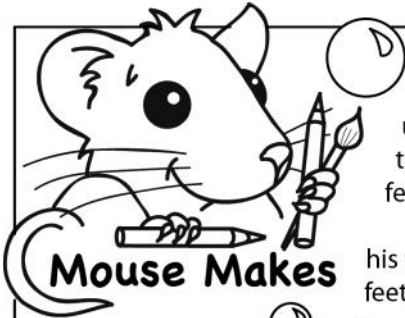
